UN Watch works to strengthen the role of democracies within the world body and to uphold the UN Charter guarantee of equal treatment for all nations large and small. UN Watch is outspoken for victims of human rights violations around the world, and organizes the annual Geneva Summit for Human Rights and Democracy on behalf of 25 NGOs (www.genevasummit.org). Affiliated with the American Jewish Committee (AJC), UN Watch stands at the forefront in the struggle against anti-Semitism and anti-Israel bias at the UN. About the Fellowship

We are currently accepting applications for the one-year Richard and Rhoda Goldman Graduate Fellowship at UN Watch, to begin in October 2010.

Requirements:

1. Superb writing ability in English, demonstrated by publications. Candidates must be able to write publishable-quality articles on the issues covered by UN Watch;
2. At least one university degree;
3. 1-3 years work experience in law, international relations, journalism or related fields;
4. Strong understanding of international relations and the history of ideas;
5. Qualities of initiative, intellectual curiosity and ability to work in a small, team-oriented environment operating under strict deadlines;
6. Commitment to the UN Watch mission, with demonstrable interest in promoting human rights and combating anti-Semitism.

Responsibilities of a UN Watch Fellow include drafting reports, speeches, op-eds, press releases and correspondence; monitoring and reporting on meetings at the UN; researching and fact-checking; website maintenance; and occasional assistance with administrative functions.

The Fellowship is located in Geneva, Switzerland, and offers generous terms including: Annual stipend and accommodation in a studio apartment; health insurance; and travel to and from Geneva.

Deadline: Applications must be received by **September 8, 2010**. However, we will start processing applications on a rolling basis. For more information, contact: fellowship2010@unwatch.org.

2. At least two writing samples, preferably not more than 1,000 words each. Published op-eds or other articles are ideal, no matter the subject.
3. A recent, passport-size photograph of yourself with your name written on the back.
4. A list of references, including at least two from employers, with full contact information.
